

The Word Part 4

Now that I have explained the Father son and the Holy Spirit relationship, let's deal with how this relationship work on your behalf with an illustration:

1 Timothy 2:4-5 For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus.

This Scripture shows God The Father and it shows that Jesus is our intercessor, our mediator between us and the heavenly Father.

Jesus told us in the scripture that when he leaves to go to the heavenly Father that he would send us another comforter, and that comforter is the Holy Spirit who provides guidance, direction, instruction, etc.

The Bible also states that Jesus was tempted at all points meaning he was tempted in every way yet he never sinned. Jesus went through everything that you and I could possibly go through or be tempted by and that made it possible for him to identify with you and I. He can identify now with our struggles, situations, and why we do the things that we do.

Think about this for a moment, When looking at a person that is saved, and we called it "covered by the blood of Jesus" who do you see? We see that person and we recognize that person but what if we were to throw a bucket of red paint to cover that person? What would you see then? You would see the red paint. If the Christian is covered by the blood of Jesus, not actual physical blood, but spiritual, then when God see the Christian, he also see the shed blood of his Son that covers our sin. So now Jesus can say to his Father as He did on the cross, Father forgive them, for they know not what they do. Jesus knows what it's like when we go through because he has went through everything that humans could possibly go through. All of the problems, the struggles and the situations. So here is where the Holy Spirit comes in to help guide us, direct us, and instruct us. The Holy Spirit can identify with us because of what Jesus experienced!

Jesus in the Old Testament as Lord

As we have already read and established, John said that in the beginning was the Word and The Word with God, and The Word was God and The Word is Jesus.

Now let's discuss the who, what, when, where how and why?

In Genesis 3, the Bible says that the serpent was cleverer than all the wild animals that the LORD God had made. Obviously, the woman understood the language of the serpent as he asked the woman, "Did God really say, 'You must never eat the fruit of any tree in the garden'?" Then the woman answered the snake, "We're allowed to eat the fruit from any tree in the garden except the tree in the midst of the garden. God said, 'You must never eat it or touch it. If you do, you will die!'" The serpent said to her: "You certainly won't die!" "God knows that when you eat it your eyes will be opened. You'll be like God, knowing good and evil."

The woman saw that the tree had fruit that was good to eat, nice to look at, and desirable for making someone wise. So, she took some of the fruit and ate it. She also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it.

Then their eyes were opened, and they both realized that they were naked. They sewed fig leaves together and made clothes for themselves.

In the cool of the evening, the man and his wife heard the LORD God walking around in the garden. So they hid from the LORD God among the trees in the garden. The LORD God called to the man and asked him, "Where are you?"

Here is an important note that we'll address later: God knew exactly where Adam was physically because God knows everything. The fellowship had now been broken. Adam and Eve now have sin on them, and God does not.

Adam answered, "I heard you in the garden. I was afraid because I was naked, so I hid." God asked, "Who told you that you were naked? Did you eat fruit from the tree I commanded you not to eat from?" Adam blames Eve and answered, "That woman (Eve), the one you gave me, gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it."

Then the LORD God asked the woman, "What have you done?" So Eve reply's to God and blames the serpent and answered, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate,".

So the LORD God said to the serpent, "Because you have done this, You are cursed more than all the wild or domestic animals. You will crawl on your belly (so that implies the serpent once walked on its hind legs. Scientist and people who study animals has also mentioned that the snake has tiny legs under it).

God continues to curse the serpent by telling it, that it will be the lowest of animals as long as it lives. You and the woman will be hostile toward each other. I will make your descendants and her descendant hostile toward each other. Her descendant will crush your head, and you will bruise his heel."

Notice the above paragraph: "I will make your descendants (this plural word descendants mean more than one and refers to all Satan's followers) and her descendant (this word descendant is singular and refers to God's Son who would later redeem man's fellowship back to God).

¹⁶ The Lord God said to the woman,

"I will increase your pain and your labor
when you give birth to children.
Yet, you will long for your husband,

and he will rule you.”

¹⁷ Then he said to the man, “You listened to your wife and ate fruit from the tree, although I commanded you, ‘You must never eat its fruit.’

The ground is cursed because of you.

Through hard work you will eat food that comes from it every day of your life.

¹⁸ The ground will grow thorns and thistles for you,
and you will eat wild plants.

¹⁹ By the sweat of your brow, you will produce food to eat until you return to the
ground,

because you were taken from it.

You are dust, and you will return to dust.”

Here is a powerful revelation, man violated God’s word by disobedience. Both Adam and the tree came out of the ground and now the ground was cursed because of Adams sin. Adam and Eve was not meant to go back to the ground as they were meant to live forever as would all of us. Now, after death, we have to go to the ground, but the Lord will raise us up with an incorruptible body and immortality, as mentioned in the New Testament. Basically, starting all over again with our lives.

²⁰ Adam named his wife Eve [Life] because she became the mother of every living person.

²¹ The LORD God made clothes from animal skins for the man and his wife and dressed them.

²² Then the LORD God said, “The man has become like one of us, since he knows good and evil. He must not reach out and take the fruit from the tree of life and eat. Then he would live forever.” ²³ So the LORD God sent the man out of the Garden of Eden to farm the ground from which the man had been formed. ²⁴ After he sent the man out, God placed angels and a flaming sword that turned in all directions east of the Garden of Eden. He placed them there to guard the way to the tree of life.

In reference to the statement that I mentioned above when I said, “***The fellowship had now been broken. Now, Adam and Eve have sin on them, and God does not.***” The Lord does not want to destroy his creation, it is not His will that anyone should perish. God has a plan for man’s redemption back to Himself, and that plan is for part of Himself to be born through a woman, live as a man in which is the only way to identify with them, to understand from a humanistic point of view, what makes a man do what he does from a sinful standpoint, think the way he think and act the way he act within that sinful nature. And so the Godhead implement the plan to walk among man, identify with him and restore the fellowship.
